TIERED CARE COORDINATION PILOT AWARD

On December 12, 2020, Trillium Health Resources was awarded the opportunity to pilot the Tiered Care Coordination (TCC) program in Pitt County. The Child Tiered Care Coordination pilot was developed from the Governor's Task Force on Mental Health to address high rates of exposure to trauma and high behavioral health needs, specific to youth and families involved in child welfare and juvenile justice system. Assessing, treating, and coordinating a youth's behavioral health and life domain needs can assist social services in maintaining and reunifying youth with their families and can assist juvenile justice in keeping youth from moving deeper into the justice system. Through this familydriven and youth-guided project, the goal is to reduce the need for out-of-home care and return children and adolescents to their families or natural community setting, giving them a chance for greater permanency.

Trillium will collaborate with Youth Villages, the Pitt County Department of Social Services (DSS), District 3 Division of Juvenile Justice (DJJ,) and NC Families United to implement this project. Working together, we will connect youth with the proper assessment and minimize crisis services while engaging children and families, at times, with HFW. Trillium will implement and expand High Fidelity Wraparound (HFW) to provide much needed support for children and adolescents who are already demonstrating behavioral health symptoms or have been placed in a residential setting. The High-Fidelity Wraparound model connects DJJ involved youth and DSS involved youth and their families to behavioral health services. Youth Villages has experience with the implementation of multiple HFW teams throughout the Western and Central part of NC and their experience in this project will be invaluable. This youth and family-driven pilot focuses on youth ages 6-21.

The pilot will include the following tiers:







- **Tier One** in which Trillium DSS/DJJ Liaisons and Family Navigator empower the family to move in a more positive direction. These staff are co-located at Pitt County DSS and DJJ offices. The Family Navigator can stay involved with the family for up to sixty days, but can also reengage the family at a later date if needed. Access to the Family Navigator is family-driven.
- ▲ **Tier Two** in which Trillium DSS/DJJ Liaisons and Family Navigator work with the family and youth, but in addition, the youth are connected with an assessor who can conduct a Comprehensive Clinical Assessment or Trauma-Informed Assessment and who can provide Targeted Case Management as needed. The assessor/Targeted Case Manager will be able to access family peer support from the HFW team or the Family Navigator.
- ▲ Tier Three in which Trillium DSS/DJJ Liaisons and Family Navigator will work with the family to connect to High Fidelity Wrap-around (Intensive Care Coordination) for youth involved with Juvenile Justice or in the custody of DSS who are at risk of entering residential treatment or are in residential treatment with significant impairments due to behavioral health disorders. All tier 3 youth will be served with HFW, where the youth and family learn and improved the skills to navigate service systems and are connected to natural supports.

The expected outcomes for the child/adolescent are: improved clinical outcomes, engagement in school, no new legal involvement, a reduction in the use of crisis services, and improved caregiver engagement in services. This pilot will allow: shorter times from screening to assessment, shorter times from assessment to the start of services, and shorter times to the first Child and Family Team. Through this collaborative effort, we anticipate an improved rate in the completion of services and an improved connection to community services.

We are excited about this unique opportunity to be piloted in Eastern North Carolina.

DISASTER PLANNING

We are fast approaching the prime season for hurricanes and flooding disasters. To prepare, we are sending out this reminder that disaster plans need to be reviewed and updated, staff trained/re-trained, and contingency and communication plans developed.

This year you will go to a link to share your 2021 Disaster Plan and important contact information. This requested information includes:

- Contact information for your designated "Disaster Point of Contact"
- Corporate site address and facility phone number
- Any residential sites currently in your contract (address, phone numbers)

Please note, you will need to enter each site as a separate submission. Disaster plans must be submitted through the following link: <u>2021 Disaster Plan Submission</u>

Disaster Plans are due *no later than May 1, 2021*. If no updates are needed to your 2021 Disaster Plan, you *MUST* still resubmit the plan with a new cover page displaying the current year and disaster contact info. Failure to submit your Disaster Plan for 2021 by the deadline (May 1, 2021), may result in an audit and/or plan of correction.

As many of you are aware, the Federal Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) have posted guideline requirements for all entities that receive Medicaid funds and this applies to all of our Medicaid providers. For your reference, we have attached the Final Rule that will assist you in locating the requirements to the federal rules that apply to each of your situations.

Our contract with providers requires that you have an adequate disaster planning and training process in place within your organization. While it is our desire that no one has to contend with all that a hurricane or flood brings, the reality is that eastern North Carolina has dealt with its fair share of these kinds of disasters in the past. Living in this part of North Carolina, we know that the best way to cope when a disaster strikes is preparation. Please connect with your local emergency management services, know your local resources, and stay connected with Trillium in the event of an emergency.

Final Rule

Only corporate site and residential sites need to be entered. Please do not enter all of your sites in your contract.*

FEBRUARY 2021 COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID (MHFA) TRAININGS FOR NC RESIDENTS

Mental Health First Aid teaches you how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders. These trainings will give you the skills you need to reach out and provide initial support to someone who may be developing a mental health or substance use challenge and help connect them to appropriate care. Youth Mental health First Aid (YMHFA) and Adult Mental Health First Aid (AMHFA) will be held virtually and participants are required to complete a 2-hour self-pace study prior to attending the instructor-led training.

*Registration Deadline is February 11, 2021

Although there is no cost to you, this course is valued at \$25 per person. If you must cancel your registration, please do so within 48 hours of the instructor led course. Failure to cancel within the recommended timeframe may result in a 30-day waiting period to reschedule the training.
