NC MEDICAID INNOVATIONS WAIVER PROVIDER RATE INCREASE

The NC General Assembly appropriated \$176 million in state and federal recurring funding in the Current Operations Appropriations Act of 2023 (SL 2023-134, Section 9E.15) to raise NC Medicaid Innovations waiver services rates so that Innovations services providers can in turn raise the hourly wages of the direct care workers (DCW) they employ.

Though the legislation does not specify the amount or percentage of the rate increase that must be passed through to DCW wage increases, the General Assembly states an intention of increasing the average hourly wage for DCWs in Innovations services by \$6.50 per hour to move those workers to an average wage of \$18.00/hr. The funding appropriated for State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2024 does not enable quite that large of a wage increase, but it should support significant movement in that direction.

UPCOMING RATE CHANGES

The NC Department of Health Benefits (DHB) recently announced NC Medicaid Behavioral Health service rate increases that will take effect on January 1, 2024, as well as Innovations Waiver DCW rate increases retroactive to July 1, 2023. Trillium is in the process of assessing the information provided by DHB and preparing an updated fee schedule. Further details will be released regarding the readjudication of impacted Innovations waiver claims.

PROVIDER NAME ON RE-VERIFICATION APPLICATIONS

The provider name listed on applications for re-verification must match their legal name, name on the NPPES Registry, and their name on any license, certification, and/or accreditation.

Providers can check their listed NPPES name at the Search NPI Records.

LOW INCOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP) is a federally-funded program that provides for a one-time vendor payment to help eligible households pay their heating bills.

Households including a person aged 60 or older or disabled persons receiving services through the NC Division of Aging and Adult Services are eligible to sign up for assistance from Dec. 1 - 31. All other households may apply from Jan. 1 -March 31 or until funds are exhausted.

CRISIS RESOURCES 988 SUICIDE & CRISIS LIFELINE

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN YOU CALL, TEXT OR CHAT 988?

You will be connected with a skilled, trained crisis worker who works at the Lifeline network crisis center closest to you. This person will listen to you, understand how your problem is affecting you, provide support and share any resources that may be helpful.

The Lifeline does not "trace" callers, chat or text users. For some individuals, having contact with emergency services can be traumatic and dangerous, and whenever possible the Lifeline recommends alternate options such as collaborating on a safety plan, utilizing mobile crisis teams, collaborating with the individual's loved ones or professionals, or supporting the individual to get to a Crisis Stabilization Unit, emergency department, or urgent care. 988 is available to anyone, anytime. If you or someone you know is struggling or in crisis, help is available. Risk factors for suicide include:

- History of depression or other mental illness
- Recent life crisis
- Social Isolation
- A Physical, emotional or sexual abuse, including bullying
- Previous suicide attempt
- Substance misuse
- Interpersonal conflict

NEW 988 RESOURCES

The 988 Partner Toolkit is a one-stop shop for social media, video, print, radio, FAQs, messaging, and other marketing materials for anyone to use to promote awareness of 988. Two new videos focus on teaching people about signs that may indicate someone is struggling with mental health, such as changes in behavior, sleeping too much or too little, increased drug and alcohol use, severe emotional pain, and more. Knowing the six steps to create a safety plan can demystify the process for people in need. This video walks through the safety plan steps so that people identify warning signs of crisis, coping strategies, and trusted resources. There are also new 988 Lifeline print materials that can be downloaded or ordered.

NEW INITIATIVE PROVIDES PAYMENT TO SUPPORT RELATIVES

North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services Secretary Kody H. Kinsley announced a new initiative that provides payment to relatives and family members who step in to care for children in need. The kinship care reimbursement payments are a vital resource that will support positive outcomes for children and families and encourage more people to become kinship care providers.

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH REIMBURSEMENT RATES INCREASED FOR THE FIRST TIME IN A DECADE

The North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services today announced historic Medicaid reimbursement rate increases will soon be implemented for most mental health, substance use, intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) and traumatic brain injury (TBI) services in North Carolina.

This transformative change is the first increase to the state minimum reimbursement rates for behavioral health services in more than a decade. Raising these rates will strengthen the care workforce who provide these services and increase access to care for every North Carolinian. It will also make <u>Medicaid expansion</u> more impactful for the estimated 600,000 people who will gain access to these Medicaid health care services.

NCDHHS Secretary Kody Kinsley shared an update on the progress of Medicaid Expansion, which will launch on Dec. 1, 2023. Expanding eligibility for Medicaid is the most significant investment in the health of North Carolinians in decades, providing health coverage for more than 600,000 people.

Medicaid Expansion will increase access to mental health and substance use treatment and will help build a healthier workforce in NC. CRIMINAL DISCLOSURE COMPLIANCE

Providers must require all staff/applicants to disclose any/all criminal convictions prior to hire according to 10A NCAC 27G .0202 (c). Often, the issue is staff/applicants are asked to disclose criminal convictions, "excluding misdemeanors," or "excluding minor traffic violations" on their employment application or criminal disclosure statement instead of all criminal convictions. All criminal disclosures statements and employment applications along with applicant responses will be reviewed in accordance with 10A NCAC 27G.0202 (c). Compliance to rule should reflect that the criminal disclosure statement was answered by the staff/applicant and does not allow for any exclusions.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING THE 2023-2024 NATIONAL CORE INDICATORS SURVEY

Every year Trillium Health Resources and other LME/MCOs across the state assist the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) with an annual survey of members who receive Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities services. This survey uses standard measures (core indicators) to assess the outcomes of services provided. Areas of concern addressed by the indicators include employment, member rights, service planning, community inclusion, choice, and health and safety.

The survey results are used to inform policy decisions designed to improve the system.

Your assistance and participation is crucial to the success of this project

If you provide I/DD services to members 18 years and older, you may be contacted to assist with obtaining consents and additional background information needed to administer the survey. Survey administration will be completed by a third party contracted with the State (Carolina Institute for Developmental Disabilities, CIDD).

Providers may be contacted to assist with gathering information as early as December 2023. Trillium will provide additional information, including members chosen to participate in the survey, via email. The survey sample and a minimum number of surveys are provided by the State. In order to meet these state requirements, providers may be asked to provide support with contacting members to receive consent for survey participation. Additional information may be requested for those members who choose to participate in the survey.

Requirements for Member Participation in the Survey:

- Must have an intellectual or developmental disability diagnosis
- Must receive a Medicaid Funded service from an agency providing I/DD services
- Must be at least 18 years old

QUEST ANALYTICS BETTERDOCTOR PROVIDER OUTREACH

Trillium Health Resources has contracted with Quest Analytics for network adequacy and provider directory accuracy.

On our behalf, Quest Analytics conducts provider outreach to validate the data on Trillium's Member-facing Provider Directory. Quest Analytics utilizes BetterDoctor as a solution for Provider Directory accuracy and outreach efforts. BetterDoctor will contact providers by fax, mail, email, and/or a telephone call on a quarterly basis.

The provider letter will explain the process and request the provider validate the data contained in Trillium's Member-facing Provider Directory. The providers will validate and update their data via their input into the BetterDoctor portal.
