Provider Support – Delivering Services

In response to the recent recommendations by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) regarding the delay of aerosolizing dental treatment during the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, NC Medicaid is implementing temporary clinical policy revisions that will allow dentists to provide additional services to Medicaid and NC Health Choice beneficiaries.
-  [SPECIAL BULLETIN COVID-19 #83: Title II Americans with Disabilities Act \(ADA\) and Section 504 Rehabilitation Act \(RA\) Protections during the COVID-19 Pandemic](#) (May 6, 2020). A reminder to all Medicaid providers that during COVID-19, federal law continues to require

compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and Rehabilitation Act, which includes providing reasonable accommodations for people living with disabilities.

-  [SPECIAL BULLETIN COVID-19 #81: Hospice Clinical Coverage Policy: Changes due to CMS Amendment and Other Flexibilities](#) (May 4, 2020). Due to a CMS amendment of 42 CFR 440.70 through an Interim Final Rule including two policy changes affect Medicaid hospice services due to COVID-19.
-  [SPECIAL BULLETIN COVID-19 #73: Personal Care Services Telephonic Assessments Update](#) (April 30, 2020). Our first temporary policy modification that has been rescinded. Effective May 1, 2020, Medicaid resumed use of the full assessment for all initial requests. SPECIAL BULLETIN COVID-19 #30: Personal Care Services Assessments, published March 31, 2020 indicated the use of the mini assessment for initial requests, which has been utilized until this point. Use of the full assessment will allow providers to complete service plans as required per PCS Clinical Coverage Policy 3L. All assessments will remain telephonic.

NC Medicaid has extended its temporary suspension of the Level I and Level II Preadmission Screening and Resident Reviews (PASRRs) requirement for new nursing home admissions and the requirement of a PASRR number on the prior approval, originally scheduled to expire April 24, 2020.

Prescriptions for Medicaid and NC Health Choice beneficiaries are eligible for the addition of a mailing or delivery fee via the guidelines below. NC Medicaid encourages beneficiaries to request, and pharmacy providers to mail or deliver prescriptions to beneficiaries, during the COVID-19 pandemic to achieve better social distancing within their community.
