A Comprehensive View of Catchment-Wide Activities



Prevention Grant Allocation

September 2016 - NC DMHDDSAS awarded PORT Health \$18,800 *Strategic Prevention Framework for Prescription Drugs* (SPF Rx) grant from federal Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) for prevention activities to decrease access to/prescriptions for opioid medications and to increase community awareness and support.



Medication Safety

January-December 2017 - PORT Health distributes 350 *Lock Your Meds* boxes and 250 drug disposal pouches to communities in Nash County. 200 drug disposal pouches ordered for Dare County by Power of U via Coastal Horizons, who also distributed *Lock Your Meds* boxes in Carteret, Dare and New Hanover Counties. Trillium presented Pitt County Coalition Against Substance Abuse with 10,000 free drug disposal pouches donated by Mallinckrodt Pharmaceuticals.



Cures Grant Allocation #1

May 2017 - NC is awarded \$31M 2-year grant from SAMHSA for specifically addressing Opioid crisis in the state. \$1,224,849 allocated to Trillium for treatment services. PORT Health and Coastal Horizons Center also received \$70,000 respectively directly from NC DMHDDSAS for opioid prevention activities. Coastal Horizons also received a \$50,706 Mentor/Technical Assistance allocation.



Safe Prescriber Training

October 2017 - PORT Health provided 3-hour training for 35 prescribers on safer prescribing options and use of NC Controlled Substances Reporting System (CSRS).



Cures Grant Allocations #3-5

January 2018 - 3 additional allocations to Trillium for specific identified issues:
1) \$300,000 for OTP Providers;
2) \$304,384 for Medications;
3) \$50,000 for Certified Peer Support.

Naloxone Distribution

March 2016 - Trillium purchased and distributed 100 Naloxone Kits to Jacksonville (75 kits) and Manteo (25 kits) through the NC Harm Reduction Coalition (NCHRC). Trillium donated another \$15,000 to NCHRC for 200-300 additional kits distributed primarily to law enforcement.



Naloxone Distribution

September 2016 - Trillium pledged \$100,000 to NCHRC for nearly 2,000 Naloxone kits for distribution primarily to law enforcement organizations in the Trillium service area for the period 2016-2019.



Public Awareness

January-December 2017 - PORT Health engaged 500 individuals and 12 agencies in Nash County about opioid use/misuse through speakers, prevention campaign materials, social media, news outlets, special events and community activities.



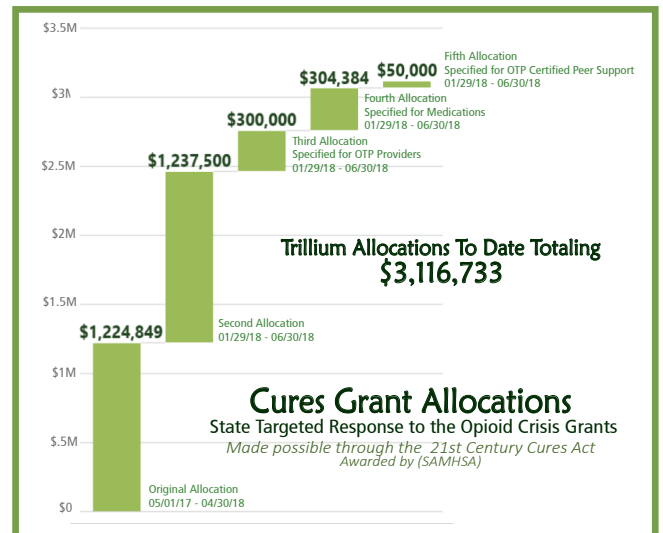
Work Group

May 2017 - Prior to LME-MCO grant distribution from State, Trillium work group formed to develop plan for quick response teams; early intervention; expanding detoxification, treatment services, peer support, and follow-up services to create recovery options.



Cures Grant Allocation #2

January 2018 - Additional \$1,237,500 allocated to Trillium to develop a continuum of intervention points, assessment, treatment and follow-up care to effectively intervene in the cycle of drug addiction.
