### THE HEALING PLACE OF NEW HANOVER COUNTY HOSTS RIBBON-**CUTTING CEREMONY**

Trillium was proud to stand alongside New Hanover County officials, The Healing Place staff, and our community partners during the ribbon cutting of The Healing Place of New Hanover County in Wilmington. The dedication and ceremony took place on January 17. The peer-led recovery facility offered hope and treatment for 200 total individuals at no cost beginning in February. Trillium staff are currently working towards a grand opening event slated for May 2023. Many thanks to all staff who put in the hard work and care over the past few years to make this dream a reality. The Healing Place of New Hanover County is the first of its kind in Southeastern North Carolina.

#### **HUD AWARDS TRILLIUM \$1.3 MILLION IN HOUSING GRANTS**

The US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) announced Trillium will receive \$1,338,023 for Permanent Supportive Housing and Rapid Rehousing. It is part of the \$2.8 billion awarded in the Continuum of Care (CoC) Competition Awards for local homeless service and housing programs across the country. They are used to help individuals and families experiencing homelessness move into permanent housing. Congratulations to our Housing team led by Amy Modlin for their perseverance and dedication to providing a place to call home for those across eastern North Carolina!

#### TAILORED PLAN LAUNCH DELAYED TO OCTOBER 2023

The North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services <u>delayed the implementation of the Tailored Plan from April 1 to October 1, 2023</u>. Construction is made possible with Trillium's Play Together Accessible Playground grants. These funds have provided towns with the ability to build fully accessible, all-inclusive playgrounds for individuals with special needs and physical disabilities. 

## OFFICERS AND FIRST RESPONDERS COMPLETE CIT TRAINING ACROSS REGION

It's incredible to see new CIT graduates across Eastern North Carolina this winter. A huge congratulations to:

- Fourteen NC Division of Adult Corrections from various Eastern Region facilities completing 40 hours of Crisis Intervention Team training at Pitt Community College in January. Dr. Glenn Johnson, a CIT community volunteer who lives with a Traumatic Brain Injury, spoke to the group at their graduation. He was recently appointed to the NC Brain Injury Advisory Council.
- Officers with the Pitt County Sheriff's Office, Greenville, Winterville, Washington, Zebulon, and Goldsboro police departments, as well as the Cherry Hospital police completing 40 hours of Crisis Intervention Team training at Pitt Community College in January.
- Seventeen members of the North Carolina Department of Adult Corrections (NC DAC; formerly NCDPS) completed the training held at Pitt Community College in February.
  The group was comprised of Correctional Officers, prison nurses, and case managers.
- Eight members of the NC DAC completed 40 hours of CIT training at Pitt Community College in March.
