One Community program prepared to support Eastern NC

One Community has launched at Trillium! This program provides community-based prevention and outreach throughout Trillium's 26 county catchment area. A Let's Play Together Inclusive event took place in Hampstead in June. The next Let's Play Together event will take place in Ayden on July 31, and an upcoming rescheduled date for an Elizabeth City event is coming soon

Looking to the future, the program will also participate in local events in each county that focus on Mental Health Matters, Suicide Awareness and Prevention, Alcohol Awareness and Recovery, and Autism Acceptance, among others. The Mobile Integrated Care Clinic hit the road in June providing services in Perquimans and surrounding counties. Trillium's One Community worked alongside PORT Health Services to launch the mobile unit to address health disparities in the area. The unit will travel to residents in rural communities where providers may be sparse.

The unit will offer inclusive opportunities and access to treatment for members with behavioral and healthcare needs. Services offered include vaccinations (COVID-19, flu, pneumonia, etc.), mental health screenings, general physical health checkups, and more.

PERCEPTIONS OF CARE SURVEYS OFFER IMPROVEMENTS FOR BETTER CARE

Every year, Trillium joins LME/MCOs across the state participate in the Perceptions of Care survey. These surveys allow Trillium to better serve our members and communities through active listening. Trillium members recently completed over five-hundred surveys that looked at numerous categories of care and personal experience. From an analysis and review of these surveys, Trillium is able to hear the needs of our communities, then take action to address those needs.

One result Trillium found was many felt concerns regarding social interactions, improved coping skills, and school/work performance. New trainings were added to Trillium's My Learning Campus to help specifically address these, as well as resources on the Coronavirus Information page. TIERED CARE COORDINATION PILOT LAUNCHED IN PITT COUNTY

Trillium was awarded the opportunity to pilot the Tiered Care Coordination (TCC) program in Pitt County in December 2020. The Child Tiered Care Coordination pilot was developed from the Governor's Task Force on Mental Health to address high rates of exposure to trauma and high behavioral health needs, specific to youth and families involved in child welfare and juvenile justice system.

Trillium will collaborate with the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Youth Villages, the Pitt County Department of Social Services (DSS), District 3 Division of Juvenile Justice (DJJ), and NC Families United to implement this project. Working together, the program connects youth with the proper assessment and minimize crisis services while engaging children and families, at times, with High Fidelity Wraparound (HFW). POLICE OFFICERS GRADUATE FROM CIT TRAINING IN MULTIPLE COUNTIES

These have included officers in Dare and Gates Counties, Ahoskie, Elizabeth City, Washington, Williamston, and Vidant, to military officers at Camp Lejeune. We thank these first responders for their passionate dedication. Officers in these areas completed 40 hours of intensive training in topic areas concerning mental health, intellectual and developmental disabilities, substance abuse, and de-escalation techniques over a one-week period.
