NOTEWORTHY:

FOSTERING LOVE CAMPAIGN PROVIDES THOUSANDS OF BAGS FOR KIDS IN FOSTER CARE

Trillium's One Community team is providing 2,000 bags for children in foster care. Fostering Love aims to lift up the self-worth of children removed from their homes due to abuse or neglect. Trillium is providing these bags to DSS Child Protective staff throughout our 28 counties. DSS staff will give them to children as they enter the foster care system. Each bag includes a soft blanket, stuffed toy, hygiene supplies, and any other personal items the child brings with them. Our hope is these items provide each child with some level of comfort for this part of their journey.

SUPPORTING EASTERN NC FOSTER FAMILIES WITH FAMILY SOLUTIONS PROVIDERS

Trillium is delivering \$1,056,151 to providers for recruitment and training of foster care families in Eastern North Carolina. The funds are part of our Family Solutions initiative to ensure families have better support to give kids the chance to just be a kid. The four providers awarded grants included:

- Children's Home Society receiving \$280,000 to serve Gates, Bertie, Chowan, Perquimans, Pasquotank, Currituck, and Camden Counties.
- Omni Visions receiving \$237,000 to serve Pamlico, Martin, Nash, Hertford, Northampton, Washington, Halifax, Dare, Tyrell, and Hyde Counties.
- Easterseals UCP receiving \$450,000 to serve Beaufort, Carteret, Craven, Jones, Onslow, Pender, Pitt, and New Hanover Counties.
- The Boys are Girls Home of North Carolina received \$89,151 to serve Columbus, Bladen, and Brunswick Counties.

Funding will cover the costs of local staff positions. Staff will recruit and develop new culturally appropriate and diverse foster care families.

HELPING OUR COMMUNITIES SAVE LIVES IN THE FIGHT AGAINST THE OPIOID EPIDEMIC

New Hanover County's Health and Human Services Director Donna Fayko joined Trillium Southern Regional Director Cecelia Peers distributing Narcan kits (Naloxone) in June. These kits can reverse the effects of an opioid overdose and can be administered by law enforcement officials and emergency medical services. Additional kits were also distributed to the sheriff's office. The delivery was part of Trillium's Opioid Remediation Funding initiative.

NEW OXFORD HOUSE OPENS ITS DOORS IN WHITEVILLE

A new Oxford House in Whiteville is now open for eight men in recovery. Oxford Houses offer a clean, sober housing option for individuals in recovery. The Whiteville location will be the 26th Oxford House in Trillium's catchment. The new location is part of the 2020 Vision for Recovery initiative. Trillium is proud to partner with Oxford House to expand hope and healing across Eastern North Carolina. OVER 60 OFFICERS AND FIRST RESPONDERS COMPLETE CIT TRAINING ACROSS THE REGION

It's incredible to see new Crisis Intervention Team training graduates across Eastern North Carolina this spring. A huge congratulations to:

- 12 members of the NC Department of Adult Corrections completed 40 hours of training in June. Correctional officers, nurses, case managers, and office staff participated. Dr. Glenn Johnson was a guest speaker who shared his story of living with a traumatic brain injury. Dr. Johnson is a former New Jersey Correctional Officer.
- 17 officers from Pasquotank, Beaufort, Pitt, Craven, Martin, and Jones Counties completed 40 hours of Crisis Intervention Team training in May.
- 11 personnel from the Eastern Region for the North Carolina Department of Adult Corrections. They completed 40 hours of training in Winterville. Dr. Johnson spoke to the officers at their training graduation.

This allows him to help members realize that far-fetched wishes can often become immediate possibilities. They provide a valuable perspective to help serve those with serious mental health, Intellectual/developmental disabilities, and substance use disorders.

Each member is either an individual with MH/SUD/IDD or a family member/guardian.
