

Trillium Intellectual Developmental Disabilities (I/DD) and Traumatic Brain Injuries (TBI) Medicaid Service Summary | Tip Sheet

*1915(i) Respite	<u>42 CFR Part 441</u> Subpart M NC DMA: Draft CCP	<i>Over age 3.</i> Provides periodic support to primary caregivers for overnight, weekend, or emergency care in the home or community. See <u>B3 Service Definition</u> ; <u>Trillium I/DD Service</u> <u>Array-Respite Services</u> ; See <u>Trillium IDD B3 Medicaid Benefit Plan</u> , Note the <u>transition of 1915(b)(3) services to 1915(i) services</u> ,
*1915(i) Supported Employment		Age 16 and older. Provides assistance with choosing, acquiring, and maintaining employment through vocational training and assessment, career counseling, resume and interview skills training, assistance in learning new skills for job retention and work adjustment. The primary outcome is competitive <u>integrated</u> employment defined as a job that pays at least minimum wage and is not specifically set aside for people with disabilities. SE must be provided in a setting where individual's work alongside other peers who do not have disabilities or in a business or micro-enterprise owned by the beneficiary. 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*1915(i) Supported Employment- Long-Term Vocational Support (LTVS)		Age 16 and older. Coaching and employment support activities that enable individuals to maintain employment. Provides ongoing assistance, counseling and guidance for individuals who operate a micro-enterprise. Provides monitoring, supervision, work adjustment training and assistance in job tasks as needed, in addition to consultation with the employer to identify work related needs and proactive engagement in supportive activities to address problems or needs. *1915(i) Community Living and Supports	<u>8P</u>	Will be offered with transition of 1915(b) services to 1915(i) services to beneficiaries ages 3 and older who have an I/DD or TBI. Enables beneficiaries to live successfully in their own home, in the home of their family or natural supports, and be an active member of their community. A paraprofessional assists the beneficiary to learn new skills and/or supports the beneficiary in activities that are individualized and aligned with the beneficiary's preferences. Emphasizes interpersonal, independent living, community living self-care, and self-determination. Service definition will be aligned with the Innovations and State funded community living and supports benefit. Community Living Facilities and Supports		Comprehensive, individualized treatment for adults with developmental disabilities to maintain and promote functional status and independence. An alternative to home and community based services waivers for individuals who potentially meet the ICF/IDD level of care based on the assessed needs, health and safety of the individual, to enable stable living in the community and promote the least restrictive level of care. Individuals choose to live in their own homes or homes where they control the lease for the room in the home along with their choice of the agency or other people who support them and an independent Care

*1915(i) One Time Transitional Costs	<u>8P</u>	Community Transition Provides initial set-up expenses for adults to facilitate their transition from a Developmental Center (institution), community ICF-IID Group Home, nursing facility or another licensed living arrangement (group home, foster home, Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facility, alternative family living arrangement), a family home or one person AFL(Alternative Family Living) to a living arrangement where the individual is directly responsible for his or her own living expenses. This service may be provided only in a private home or apartment with a lease in the beneficiary's, legal guardian's, representative's name or a home owned by the beneficiary. Expenses are furnished only to the extent that the beneficiary is unable to meet such expense or when the support cannot be obtained from other sources. To be consistent with the NC Innovations Community Transitions service definition and limitations. Research Based- Behavioral Health Treatment (RB-BHT)	<u>8F</u>	Researched-based behavioral intervention services that prevent or minimize the disabilities and behavioral challenges associated with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and promote adaptive functioning to change behaviors and promote learning, build motivation, and develop social communication. Incorporates peer mediated instruction by typically developing peers in addition to parent, guardian, and caregiver training on interventions consistent with the RB- BHT. 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Intermediate Care Facilities for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ICF/IDD)	<u>8E</u>	An institution that functions primarily for the diagnosis, treatment or rehabilitation of individuals with intellectual disabilities or persons with a related condition and provides 24-hour supervision in a protected residential setting, coordination, ongoing evaluation, planning, and integration of health or rehabilitative services to help each individual function at his or her greatest ability. See <u>Trillium IDD Medicaid B-ICF Services Benefit Plan</u>
Mobile Crisis Management (MCM)	<u>8A</u>	Mobile Crisis Management (MCM) involves immediate evaluation, triage, and access to all support, services and treatments necessary to provide integrated crisis response, crisis stabilization interventions, and crisis prevention activities on a 24/7/365 basis. See <u>Trillium IDD</u> <u>State-Funded Services Benefit Plan</u>
