

# Trillium Assistive Technology | Tip Sheet

#### ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY DOES NOT ALWAYS MEAN USE OF HIGH-TECH AND EXPENSIVE EQUIPMENT

Assistive Technology can take many forms and having this type of support can go a long way to increase long-term success to empower individuals to live as independently as possible and even help decrease the need for 24/7 supervision.

## ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY CAN BE DEVELOPED FOR USE AT HOME, SCHOOL, OR IN THE COMMUNITY

With the support of a parent, caregiver, or support staff, other low-cost items can also be obtained at the local pharmacy, hardware store, or other retailer. For example:

- Using painter's tape to help with wayfinding (e.g. to get to the elevator follow the blue line on the floor/at points along the wall)
- Homemade grips (wrapping duct tape around a pencil or spoon handle)
- Pick up and reach tool or "grabber"
- Long handled shoe-horn
- Book stand
- Alarm clocks or Pomodoro Timers
- Magnifiers
- Large print materials
- Memory aids such as a dry erase board or calendar/pocket calendar
- Assisting in learning/mapping a bus route using printed materials, familiar landmarks and streets, and mobile applications

### SOME ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY MAY REQUIRE ADDITIONAL FUNDING

- Durable Medical Equipment such as commode or shower chairs, blood sugar meters, blood pressure monitor
- A Smart-Home devices such as Amazon Echo and "Alexa," Smart plugs connected to a wall socket, smart doorbell such as "Ring," "Wallflower or other high-voltage smart plug for stove, smart thermostat or talking thermostat
- A Communication device such as speech-to-text software, or text-to-speech output software such as "read and write" or other screen reading software, symbol-making software, note-taking systems
- Audiobooks
