Individuals can access care via walk-in services that function much like a resource center without walls, allowing individuals to receive immediate assistance without the need for appointments or referrals. In addition to walk-ins, individuals can access services directly by reaching out to LINC themselves via telephone, email,	LINC offers a comprehensive range of services designed to support individuals and families impacted by incarceration through a holistic and personcentered approach. Housing is a cornerstone of LINC's programming, with options including transitional housing at the M.E.R.
